

**RICHARDSON COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS
JANUARY 8, 2025**

CALL TO ORDER

The regular meeting of the Richardson County Board of Commissioners was called to order by Chairman Caverzagie at 9:00 a.m. on Tuesday, January 8, 2025. Roll call was answered by Karas, Sickel and Caverzagie. Chairman Caverzagie gave the Invocation and Commissioner Karas led the Pledge of Allegiance. Chairman Caverzagie announced that the open meeting laws have been posted at the entrance to the meeting room.

Motion was made by Sickel to approve the minutes of the December 31, 2024, meeting as presented. Motion seconded by Caverzagie. ROLL CALL VOTE: Karas-aye, Sickel-abstain, Caverzagie-aye. Motion carried.

ROAD & BRIDGE DEPT.

Highway Superintendent, Steve Darveau updated the Board on the routine road and bridge maintenance being done this week.

LAW ENFORCEMENT CENTER

Sheriff Hardesty updated the Board on the business within the Law Enforcement Center this past week. It was reported there were 11 inmates currently being held at the Jail. A review of the incidents that occurred during the past weekend severe snowstorm was held.

A report on the statistics for 2024 was given with total bookings at 527 with 72 of those done by other agencies and 23 holds from other counties and the Sheriff's Office doing 472. Total calls were 7,190 of which 4,281 were traffic stops, 50 search warrants, 25 residential search warrants with 34 persons being arrested (total search warrants being done in Falls City-14, Stella-1, Humboldt-5, Dawson-4).

Sheriff Hardesty also reported that they continue to advertise for jailers and dispatchers to fill vacancies.

COUNTY TREASURER

The staff will be switching program software services on March 5 as the contract with Omnigo will be terminated and the staff will switch to the Justice Data software program which will be compatible with most other surrounding agencies.

It was reported that there is an opening for the maintenance position at the Law Enforcement Center as that employee has accepted the position as a Jail Supervisor.

Sheriff Hardesty also reported that the pump system in the sewer drain line is not working and is causing the odor to come into the building. He has requested service from a local contractor to correct the problem.

Sheriff Hardesty met with the Village of Stella regarding the enforcement of ordinances on a call-by-call basis. Other villages have reached out to him for this service as well. If the village decides to move forward with this service, an agreement will be drafted to detail the terms for this service.

BRIAN KIRKENDALL, EMA DIRECTOR

Brian Kirkendall, EMA Director requested to meet with the Board to relay his concern of the vote regarding his re-appointment as the EMA Director and the Noxious Weed Superintendent for 2025, and if desired, what aspects of his job performance could be improved upon.

Commissioner Karas stated he would like to see a more aggressive type of service, including meeting with firemen at mutual aid meetings, getting more involved. Mr. Karas reported that there are citizens that are upset about the October 30, 2024, storm that went through without the sirens being sounded.

Mr. Kirkendall replied that he has been requested to attend the County’s different fire department meetings and does so when invited, at least once a year. At these meetings he provides updates for the “Page My Cell” and other emergency preparation items.

Commissioner Campbell inquired on the incident command trailer and if it was ready for service if needed. Mr. Kirkendall reported that the Emergency Management incident trailer is ready for service if needed. After the trailer was purchased, there was a period of time that it was not in order for service as the new radio equipment had not yet been received. He reported that all radios have been installed and are working and internet modems and other features included are ready to go.

Discussion was then held regarding the storm of October 30, 2024, and why the sirens were not sounded. Mr. Kirkendall reported that even the National Weather Service did not detect this storm on radar. Mr. Kirkendall will be reviewing the outdoor warning siren policy with the Board in the near future.

ROAD & BRIDGE DEPT.

Steve Darveau, Jr., Highway Superintendent updated the Board on the routine maintenance being done on county roads and bridges this past week. Maintenance on roads was discussed and Mr. Darveau reported that 2 motorgraders were being serviced at this time. He reported that the grant application has been completed and submitted.

Commissioner Campbell inquired on the maintenance being done on school bus routes. Mr. Darveau explained that the designated school bus routes that he currently has on file which were received from the school districts many years ago, are some of the first to be cleared. He suggested that the County request that the school districts submit updated bus routes to the Road Department so that any changes that have been made by the schools can be also made by the County so that everyone is using the same information to help alleviate any misunderstandings.

The bridge on the road leading into the County Yard is being replaced and is being torn out this week with the replacement construction to start next week.

LAW ENFORCEMENT CENTER

Sheriff Hardesty updated the Board on the routine business within the law enforcement center the past few weeks. He reported there are 18 inmates as of today. The calls received during the month of February totaled 455 of which 202 were traffic stops, a total of 25 arrests with 24 made from the Sheriff's Office and 1 from another agency.

Electric Contracting Company will be starting within the next week to replace and install the improved electronic system that operates the doors, cameras and other items at the Law Enforcement Center. Sheriff Hardesty reported that inmates may have to be housed in another facility for a short time while this work is being done but all efforts will be done to maintain the inmates at the jail to avoid any additional costs. The project should be completed within 1 to 3 weeks.

It was reported that Airstream Heating and Cooling have replaced the 2 existing sewage ejector pumps, float switches, seal sewage pit and reworked the pump venting to proper specifications which has eliminated the odor at the Law Enforcement Center. This was approved at the February 19, 2025, meeting.

WHEREAS, the rededication ceremony represents as further stated by P.B. Weaver, "if for no other purpose than to remind us all of the common duty we owe to all of us collectively; respect, for the law and its administration, without which our American liberties would be short lived".

NOW, THEREFORE, the Richardson County Board of Commissioners do hereby proclaim this 23rd day of April, 2025 as an historical event to be recorded in the official records of Richardson County as the

100 Year Anniversary and Rededication of the Richardson County Courthouse

LAW ENFORCEMENT CENTER

Sheriff Hardesty updated the Board on the routine business within the Law Enforcement Center this week. He reported that currently there are 17 inmates being held at the jail. The Department also received approval for the "Click-It or Ticket" overtime grant funding for the period of May 12 thru June 1. The County will be reimbursed for the overtime that deputies work during this time period.

Region V is offering spectrometers to different agencies within the district area of Region V. The purchase of this equipment is being funded through the Opioid settlement funds that Region V has received. Further information on the acquisition of this specialized equipment will be reviewed at a further meeting.

Discussion was also held regarding the improvements to the generator system at the law enforcement center so that service would be provided to more of the building when power is out. Quotes for this improvement are expected to be received within this week and will be reviewed at next week's meeting.

It was also reported that Commissioner Karas and Sheriff Hardesty will be meeting with the City of Humboldt City Council next Tuesday to review a proposed updated contract for Law Enforcement for the City of Humboldt. The current contract will expire on August 31, 2025.

Sheriff Hardesty also reported that an employee has begun training at the Law Enforcement Academy and is expected to complete the course sometime in August.

FC SW PROJECT OPEN SEALED BIDS

At 9:30 a.m. Chairman Caverzagie presented the proof of publication for the opening of sealed bids for the Falls City SW project pipe replacement project located between Sections 20 & 29, T1, R16.

Bids were received from the following: Van Dorn Valley Construction of Denton, NE for \$47,439.89; Malone Construction Co. Inc., of Douglas, NE for \$80,695; Sibbersen Excavating of Valley, NE for \$147,527.50 and Bauer Infrastructure, LLC of Martell, NE for \$96,857.50.

GRIEVANCE HEARING

A representative, Chris Morton from the NAPFSCME was present to review with the Board in accordance with the Collective Bargaining Agreement between NAPE/AFSCME Local 61 and Richardson County, as an agreement was not reached in Step 1 of the grievance process outlined in Article 3 of the Collective Bargaining Agreement, and that in accordance with Step 2 of the grievance process, this grievance was presented to the County Board within five work days of the decision of the Highway Superintendent. The grievance filed and which was signed by Justin Hubly, Executive Director of NAPE AFSCME Local 61 filed by Bryan Dettman, Ron Ramer and Wyatt Martin with the Highway Superintendent on April 10, 2025, regarding the request to use civil leave on March 24, 2025, to attend hearing on CIR case #1569 instead of vacation and/or PTO leave being used. Their statement of grievance is as follows: "On April 4, 2025, Mr. Dettmann, Mr. Martin, and Mr. Ramer received their paychecks. Upon receipt, they discovered that their request to use civil leave on March 24, 2025, was not processed, and instead they had vacation and PTO leave deducted. Mr. Dettman, Mr. Martin, and Mr. Ramer which each subpoenaed to appear before the Nebraska Commission of Industrial Relations on March 24, 2025. Each gave testimony in a work-related impasse case CIR Case No. 1569. Article 11.16(c) states that time spent by employees appearing in court as a function of their job shall be considered as hours worked." Relief Sought states: "To be made whole, Mr. Dettmann, Mr. Martin, and Mr. Ramer must be placed on civil leave and have their vacation and/or PTO leave returned."

The grievance was denied by the Highway Superintendent and was answered as follows: "The collective bargaining agreement (CBA) between your union and the County does not provide that you will be paid for your time off to testify on behalf of your union pursuant to a subpoena requested by your union. The County has not agreed in the Collective Bargaining Agreement that you will be paid by the County for the time you spent testifying for your union. Your testimony on March 24, 2025, before the Nebraska Commission of Industrial Relations was required by your union not the County. Accordingly, the County is denying your request that you should be paid by the County for your absence from work on March 24, 2025. Furthermore denying your request to have your vacation and/or PTO leave returned for the absence from work on this day."

As stated within the Collective Bargaining Agreement **11.16 CIVIL LEAVE:** All employees shall be eligible for paid civil leave under the following conditions: **c. Court Appearance:** Time spent by employees appearing in court as a function of their job shall be considered as hours worked. All witness fees received as a result of these court appearances

shall be returned to the County. Employees attending courts as a plaintiff, defendant or witness on non-work-related matters, may use vacation leave or earned compensatory time. In the event the employee is subpoenaed for non-work related matters, and does not have vacation leave or compensatory time the Employer shall grant a leave of absence. The employee shall keep any witness fee paid to the employee for these court appearances.

The Board will be reviewing the information presented regarding this grievance and will discuss it further at next week’s meeting and make a decision to be forwarded back to the NAPE AFSCME Local 61.

ROAD AND BRIDGE DEPARTMENT

Highway Superintendent, Steve Darveau, Jr. updated the Board on the routine maintenance being done on county roads and bridges this past week.

A discussion was held on rock hauling and placement on county roads and the amount of rock that the County purchases. Mr. Darveau presented to the Board information on the amount of rock that is placed on county roads within each precinct and the costs that are involved. The Sheriff also requested that the proposed salary increases presented be approved and to become effective July 1, 2025. The increases are proposed as follows: 2% increase for deputies/sergeants; office assistant from \$23.00/hour to \$25.00/hour (8%); dispatchers to increase to a range of \$20.00/hour to \$23.00/hour from a top of \$21.00/hour; dispatch supervisor from \$23.00/hour to \$25.00/hour; communications director from \$25.50/hour to \$27.00/hour; jail supervisor from \$22.44/hour to \$24.00/hour; jail shift supervisor at \$23.00/hour; jailers at a range of \$19.00/hour to \$22.00/hour from \$20.00/hour. The Board took no action at this time.

FALLS CITY EDGE

Lucas Froeschl, Executive Director of the Falls City Economic Development & Growth Enterprise presented to the Board a request for continued funding to the organization from Richardson County and a renewal agreement. Road Department Foreman, Julie Vollmer updated the Board on the routine maintenance being done on county roads and bridges the past week. The report included progress being made on getting ditches cleaned in certain areas and on construction projects. Equipment maintenance was also discussed.

A letter was received from Chuck and Gloria Hunzeker of Humboldt regarding the condition of the 710 Road west of Highway 105.

LAW ENFORCEMENT CENTER

Sheriff Hardesty updated the Board on the routine business within the Law Enforcement Center this week. He provided a report to the Board on the activity of the Sheriff's Department in July in which there were a total of 43 arrests (5 other agencies and 38 from County Sheriff); 1157 total calls which included 377 traffic stops. A grant to compensate for overtime accrued by deputies for traffic speed enforcement during the period of July 14 through August 1 was awarded to Richardson County through the Nebraska Department of Transportation and during this period of time there were 766 total calls with 259 traffic stops in which 84 citations were issued and 27 arrests made. Currently there are 18 inmates being held at the Jail with 3 of those being held for other counties.

Sheriff Hardesty reported that the State Jail Standards will be conducting the Annual Jail Inspection on August 19.

A review of the Sheriff's fiscal year 2025-2026 budget was held.

QUAD COUNTY HISTORICAL SOCIETY

During the review with Odis Fields, Veterans Service Officer, discussion was held regarding the current salaries of the officer and assistant. Mr. Fields presented to the Board information on the funds received in the County from the work the office does for veterans and salary information.

COUNTY TREASURER

County Treasurer, Amanda Bartek-Ramsey presented to the Board pledge security receipts that require an exchange with F&M Bank. Motion was made by Caverzagie to approve the replacement of the following pledge securities: Receipts #JC92998E, #JC92998A and #JC92998D will be replaced with receipts #JC93048B and #JC94842C. Motion seconded by Karas. ROLL CALL VOTE: Karas-aye, Campbell-aye, Caverzagie-aye. Motion carried.

The Board also reviewed the fiscal year 2025-2026 budget of the Treasurer's Office with Treasurer, Amanda Bartek-Ramsey and Deputy Treasurer, Rachel Jean. Brian Kirkendall, EMA Director and Samantha Scheitel, County Attorney requested to review with the Board the floodplain/floodway ordinance and possible changes that could be made to alleviate some of the current restrictions.

A letter in the form of a template was presented to the Board for their approval, to be sent to property owners by the County when the County becomes aware of any improvements or construction that would be in violation of the current ordinance. The Board agreed that this letter should be forwarded to any property owner when the County has been made aware that possible improvements are being made, etc.

Elijah Kaufman from Nebraska Department of Natural Resources and Jared Reimers representing Congressman Adrian Smith's Office were also in attendance to answer questions and explain the requirements and differences between FEMA's description of floodway and floodplain and the importance for Richardson County to maintain and enforce the State of NE regulations of floodway and floodplains. Mr. Kaufman explained to the Board that a process titled "Letter of Map Revision" could be obtained through a licensed engineer which would be reviewed by FEMA and if approved would allow the change of a floodway area back to a floodplain, moving the floodway to a different area, etc. This process can be costly for the County and Mr. Reimers explained that there could possibly be some federal grant funding available. Mr. Kaufman also suggested that the Natural Resource District could have grant funds available for this as well.

The County will be considering revisions to the current ordinance to be less restrictive and still remain in accordance with the regulations of the State of Nebraska.

The Board recess at 1:07 p.m. and Commissioner Karas excused himself from the meeting at 1:07 p.m. due to other commitments. The Board reconvened at 2:00 p.m.

KINGERY CONSTRUCTION

The Board met with representatives from Kingery Construction Co. of Lincoln, NE to review the condition of the tuckpoint on the upper area of the Courthouse and problems with rain water run-off in the lower level tunnel area.

The representatives will compile a report of their findings and submit to the Board for review and consideration for these problems to be corrected by their firm.

ROAD & BRIDGE DEPT.

Highway Superintendent, Steve Darveau, Jr. updated the Board on the routine road and bridge maintenance being done this week. The recent heavy rains and the current road conditions resulting from the rains were discussed.

Mr. Darveau reported that the new loader is to be delivered sometime this week and that a contractor is reviewing the condition of the roof of the main shop at the Falls City County yard to determine the cost for repair and/or replacement. The regular meeting of the Richardson County Board of Commissioners was called to order by Chairman Caverzagie at 9:00 a.m. on Wednesday, December 31, 2025. Roll call was answered by Karas, Campbell and Caverzagie. The Invocation was given by Chairman Caverzagie and the Pledge of Allegiance was led by Vice-Chairman Karas. Chairman Caverzagie announced that the open meeting laws have been posted at the entrance to the meeting room.

A motion was made by Karas to approve the minutes of the December 24, 2025, meeting as presented. Motion seconded by Caverzagie. ROLL CALL VOTE: Karas-aye, Campbell-aye, Caverzagie-aye. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Caverzagie to approve the agenda as posted. Motion seconded by Karas. ROLL CALL VOTE: Karas-aye, Campbell-aye, Caverzagie-aye. Motion carried. The agenda is posted at the Richardson County Courthouse in the First Floor Lobby, the Lower-Level Lobby and on the Commissioner's Meeting Room door on the 2nd Floor and on the Richardson County website www.richardsoncountyne.gov.

FOUR COUNTY JUVENILE SERVICES

Linda Volker, administrator of the 4 County Juvenile Services Grant presented to the Board an annual update and statistics of the program. The grant application will be for the next fiscal year will soon be submitted to the NE Crime Commission with Nemaha County being the lead county on the grant. The program has been in place for approximately 14 years serving juveniles in Pawnee, Johnson, Nemaha and Richardson Counties.

Motion was made by Karas to approve and enter into a memorandum of understanding with Pawnee, Johnson and Nemaha counties to agree to the conditions enumerated within the agreement to provide this County Juvenile Services Program in the counties. COUNTY TREASURER

ROAD & BRIDGE DEPT.

Steve Darveau, Jr., Highway Superintendent updated the Board on the routine road and bridge maintenance being done this week. It was reported that crews are hauling scrap iron to Pawnee City this week to get the yard cleaned up. A listing is also being made of items that will be offered for sale on the next "Big Iron" sale. Mr. Darveau also reported that the County has been awarded a grant through the NE Department of Environmental Quality to hold a tire recycling event in 2026.

The board held a discussion at this time regarding the possibility of letting out for bid specifications for road rock to be delivered to certain stockpile areas within the County. The Board will be working to determine specifications to include within the bid notice.

LAW ENFORCEMENT CENTER

Sheriff Hardesty updated the Board on the routine business within the Law Enforcement Center this past week. He reported on several different maintenance items that are currently being addressed at the Law Enforcement Center.

The Sheriff explained to the Board a software program that serves as an inventory record to be utilized within the jail facility, Guardian RFID. The cost of this software program is \$5,800.00 and will interface with the Jail program EForce. The company would install the program and allow the use by the department with payment not to be required until July 1, 2026, so that funding could be provided in the new fiscal year budget. Motion was made by Karas to approve the purchase of the software program, Guardian RFID and the quote for the additional service from EForce to interface with this change and to authorize the Sheriff to sign the agreements as presented. Motion seconded by Caverzagie. ROLL CALL VOTE: Karas-aye, Campbell-aye, Caverzagie-aye. Motion carried.

He also explained the T.A.P. Officer Training Program and the quote received from Complete Tactical Consultants from Omaha. The quote for this training program is \$2,000. The Sheriff and Board will review this matter further.

The Sheriff presented to the Board information on restraint devices available from StunTronics. This equipment would be used to assist with the transport of and appearances of inmates in the courts. Motion was made by Campbell to approve the purchase of StunTronics Bandit System for \$1,900.00. Motion seconded by Karas. Karas-aye, Campbell-aye, Caverzagie-aye. Motion carried.

BRIAN KIRKENDALL, EMA DIRECTOR

Brian Kirkendall, EMA Director, met with the Board to present information regarding the Radio Interoperability for Richardson County. He participated in a conference call, along with Commissioner Campbell and representatives of SE NE Development District with Senator Fisher's office who is planning to request that funding needed for this project be included in appropriations funding. The cost to the County would be 20% of the total cost of the project. Two different proposals are being considered through Motorola Solutions: 1) Fire/EMS-AES System at \$1,446,959.89 with 20% of county share at \$289,391.98 and 2) Fire/EMS-Statewide at \$1,632,301.15 with 20% of county share at \$326,460.23. The plans for the project need to be decided as the County Board will need to complete and sign the grant application shortly after it is received in early March.

Rachel Jean, Clerk from the Village of Rulo, was requested by the Village Board of Trustees to meet with the County Board to review with them the interlocal agreement between the cities and villages regarding the outdoor warning sirens. The Village of Rulo is requesting that the village be made aware of when and what type of maintenance to the sirens will be done as the County will be responsible for the maintenance. Mr. Kirkendall stated that the County would send the maintenance contract for the outdoor warning sirens to the Village for their record. Mrs. Jean indicated that this would be sufficient for their records.

DISCUSSION ON SALARY RESOLUTION FOR 2027-2031 TERM OF OFFICE

The Board held a discussion to review information to establish the resolution setting the salaries for the term of office, January 2027 through January 2031.

Present for this discussion were Pam Scott, Clerk of District Court; Kim Riggs, County Assessor; Amanda Bartek-Ramsey, County Treasurer; Sheriff Hardesty; Steve Darveau, Jr., Highway Superintendent and Samantha Scheitel, County Attorney.
